## Elementary: You stink! Kilikili.

My gad! Ang baho ng kilikili mo! - Oh my God! Your armpits stink!  
Talaga?? - Really??  
Sobra. Gumamit ka ba ng deodorant? - Super. Did you use deodorant?  
Oo, gumamit ako. - Yeah, I used deodorant!  
Eh bakit ang baho? - Why does it stink then?

Verb for the day:

Gamit – to use

Additional verbs (which use the syllable *UM* for conjugation):

bili – to buy

uwi – to go home

alis – to leave

kain – to eat

inom – to drink

punta – to go

**Past tense** – add the syllable *um* before the first vowel of the word

*Bumili* ako ng deodorant kahapon. – I bought deodorant yesterday.

*Uminom* siya ng beer kagabi. - He drank beer last night.

**Present tense** – replicate the first syllable of the root word then add the syllable *um* before the first vowel of the word

*Gumagamit* ako ng deodorant araw-araw. – I use deodorant everyday.

*Umiinom* si Juliebeth ng gatas. – Juliebeth is drinking milk.

*Kumakain* si Honeypurr ng sinigang. – Honeypurr is eating sinigang.

**Future tense** – simply replicate the first syllable of the root word

*Bibili* ako ng deodorant bukas. - I will buy deodorant tomorrow.

*Pupunta* ka ba sa eskwela mamaya? - Will you go to school later?

*Aalis* ako sa Sabado. - I will leave on Saturday.
