Newbie Lesson: It's So Hot. Arte mo.

Ang init ngayon! Natutunaw ako! - It's so hot today! I'm melting!
Exage ka naman. Hindi kaya. - You're exaggerating. It isn't that hot.
Bakit ka ganyan? - Why do you have to be that way?
Ang arte mo eh. - Because you're so fussy.

Tambay Talk:

Natutunaw ako! – I'm melting!
tunaw – to melt

Additional verbs (which follow the verb tense construction below):

ligo – to take a bath	galit – to get angry	nood – to watch
gising – to wake up	asar – to get pissed	panis – to go bad (for food, etc)

Simple Verb Tenses and Construction:

past tense - use the prefix *na*

Natunaw yung yelo. – The ice melted.

Nagising sila kanina. – They woke up awhile ago.

Naligo siya kahapon. – He took a bath yesterday.

present or present progressive tense - use the prefix *na* and replicate the *first syllable* of the verb

Natutunaw yung yelo. – The ice is melting. The ice melts.

Nanonood siya ng TV ngayon. – He/she is watching television now.

Nagagalit siya araw-araw. – He gets angry every day.

future tense - use the prefix *ma* and replicate the *first syllable* of the verb

Matutunaw yung yelo. - The ice will melt.

Mapapanis yung gatas bukas. – The milk will go bad tomorrow.
