Newbs: Umuulan! Umuulan!

Umuulan! Umuulan!.	- It's raining! It's raining!
Hala! Wala akong payong!	- Oh no! I don't have an umbrella!
Patay ka!! Umuulan! Umuulan!	- You're dead! It's raining! It's raining!
Oo na! Oo na! Patay ako! PATAY AKO!	- Yeah! Yeah! I'm dead! I'm dead!

Tambay Talk:

Umuulan!	- It's raining!
Wala akong payong!	- I don't have an umbrella!

You can also say:

Wala akong damit!	- I don't have any clothes!
Wala akong pera!	- I don't have any money!
Wala akong dala!	- I didn't bring anything!
Wala akong oras!	- I don't have any time!
Wala akong bahay!	- I don't have a house!

Simple Verb Tenses for the verb *ulan*:

<i>Umulan</i>	- It rained.
<i>Umuulan</i>	- It is raining.
<i>Uulan</i>	- It will rain.

New Vocabulary word: *Ambon!*

The best way to describe it is as a light rain shower. It's Ulan to a lesser degree. Figure it out: Umambon, Umaambon, Aambon. Can you tell which tense is which?
