I. Ang sarap nito!

Ang sarap [“so” delicious] **nito** [this]!

- **Ang** – gives emphasis to the word following it
 - Phrase Pattern: **Ang** + adjective + **nito**.

Ang mura nito. <i>Mura [cheap]</i>	This is cheap.
Ang laki nito. <i>Laki [large, also, size]</i>	This is big.
Ang liit nito. <i>Liit [small]</i>	This is small.
Ang init nito. <i>Init [hot]</i>	This is hot. [heat not “sultry”]
Ang mahal nito. <i>Mahal [expensive]</i>	This is expensive.
Ang layo noon. <i>Layo [far, also, distance]</i>	That is far.
Ang tagal niya. <i>Tagal [length of time]</i>	She/he is taking long.

II. Ano ba iyan?

- **Ano** [what] **iyon** [that]? - “ba” is there for emphasis
 - Akin to: What’s that? vs What *is* that?
- **Iyon** – that [near], **Iyon** – that [afar], **Ito** – this

Ano baaaaaaa?! - Something someone usually says in response to something annoying or the like. Akin to saying “What *are* you doing? (+Why?)” or “Wtf?!”
